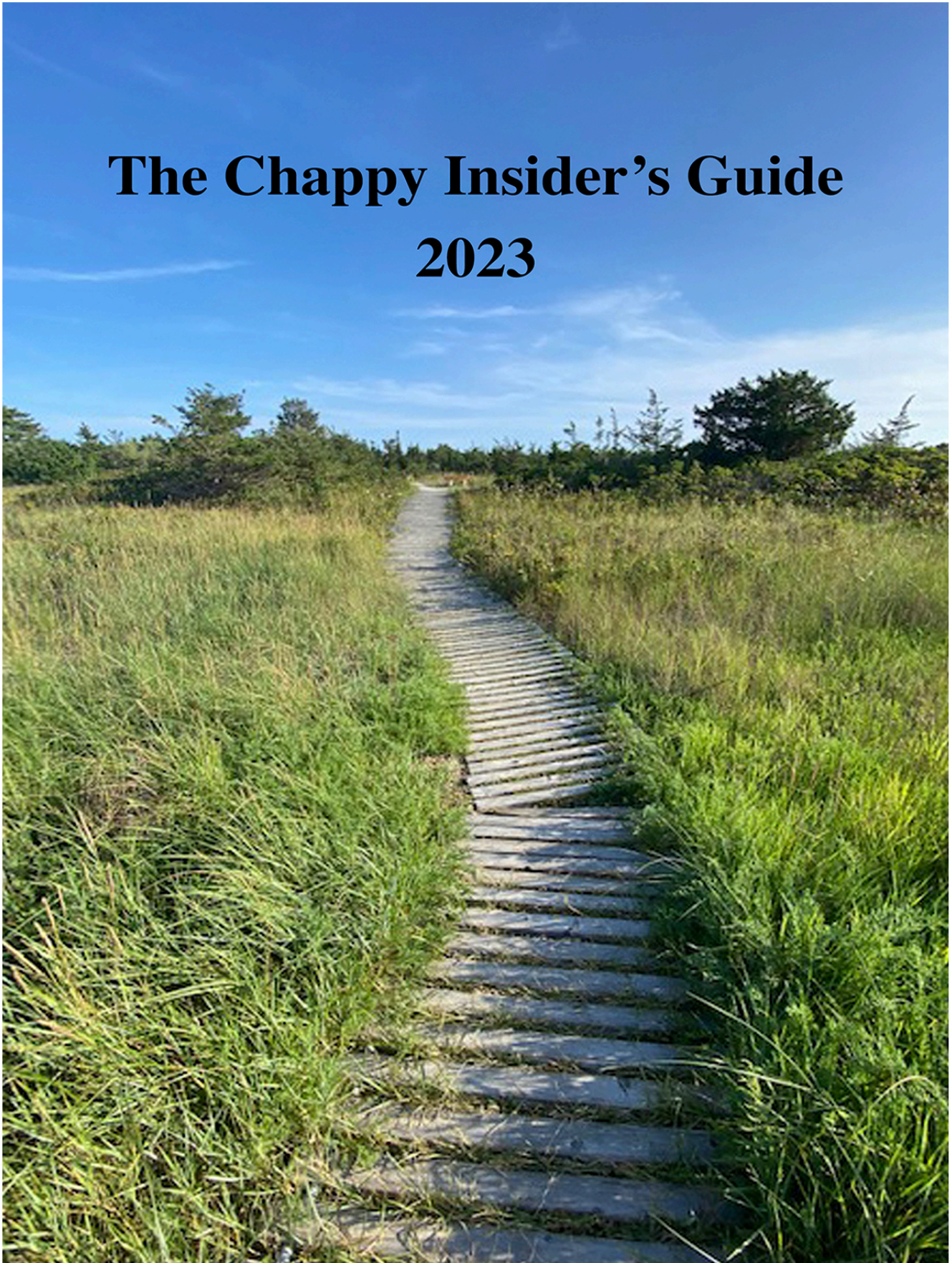

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Animal Control

Kimberly Andrade, the Edgartown Animal Control Officer (508-939-1782), wants to stress two points for Chappy residents and visitors.

(1) There is a leash law on Chappy. The only exception is when the dog is on their own property. Owners who allow their dogs to chase or molest deer, livestock, or fowl violate state law.

(2) To facilitate the return of your missing pet, any dog that visits Chappy for 30 days or more during the year should get an Edgartown dog license. This is recommended even if your dog has another Massachusetts town license.

Bikes

Ride with the traffic--single file. There are bike racks at many Chappy destinations such as the Point, Blackbird at Jerry's Place, the Chappaquiddick Community Center, Quammos landing, and The Trustees properties. There is air for tires at Mytoi on Dike Rd.

Car Rental & Livery Services

AVIS (508-548-2420)/BUDGET (508-540-1150) at 276 Palmer Ave (the SSA Palmer Ave parking lot). Rental agencies open Monday-Friday 8:30am-6pm, Saturday-Sunday 8:30am-3pm. There is a drop box for car returns after hours.

ENTERPRISE has car rental offices in Falmouth and New Bedford and will meet you at the ferries. Falmouth (508-540-7784) at 55 Davis Straits is open Monday-Friday 8am-5pm, Saturday 9am-noon, closed Sunday. New Bedford (508-995-1132) at 430 Ashley Blvd is open Monday-Friday 8am-5pm, Saturday 9am-noon, closed Sunday.

Chappaquiddick Community Center (CCC)

Everyone is welcome at the Chappaquiddick Community Center for regular events such as book sales, yoga, Mahjong, table tennis, lobster rolls, and an ice cream window, and special events such as music concerts, talks, meetings, and a calendar

photo contest. Open for browsing is the CCC library's collection of books by local authors, children's books and games, and books about Chappy history, flora and fauna. Coffee, tea or hot cocoa is available. There is a children's play set, tennis court, pickle ball and half-court basketball, and free wifi access on the porch 24/7. The CCC is supported by contributing membership fees (\$75-\$125 per family), generous donations to the CCC Endowment Fund, or to specific operating expenses, and building rentals. The Center is an IRC Section 501 (c) (3) nonprofit corporation and all donations are tax deductible. Contributing members may enroll in fee-based programs for sailing and tennis lessons, and a tennis court-use membership (\$25-\$50) to access in-person sign up for court time. Online sign ups, donations and purchases are also available on the website. The CCC welcomes volunteers for various events. Chappaquiddick Island Association (CIA)

The Chappaquiddick Island Association (CIA) is a non-profit organization, founded in 1952, whose members are interested in Chappy issues such as the impact of climate change, open space, transportation, water quality, zoning, and utilities on the island. It has over 300 year-round and seasonal members who are kept informed through annual meetings, a Speaker's series on issues of concern, and periodic newsletters. Emails from the CIA keep members up to date with current events. Anyone may join, however only property owners may vote. Suggested family membership is \$50/yr., but any donation is accepted. Chappaquiddick Island Association Open Space Committee--Chappy Fund

The Chappaquiddick Island Association Open Space Committee was established to preserve and protect the rare and diverse landscape of Chappaquiddick. Their goals include expanding open spaces in partnership with other conservation organizations, maintaining and increasing Chappy's trail systems and access to shores and recreation lands, preserving and enhancing vistas, and providing education about open space. Since 1998 more than 500 of Chappy's 3600 acres have been preserved through the donations of more than 300 people.

The CIA Open Space Committee works with the Sheriff's Meadow Foundation, a Sec. 501(c)(3) organization, which accepts donations for a Chappy Fund, and with Martha's Vineyard Land Bank, to share costs of land parcels and accept donations of money, land or permanent conservation restriction. Chappy Ferry

The Chappy Ferry, at 53 Dock Street, Edgartown, is our lifeline to the main island. During the summer season the ferry runs continuously every day from 6:30am until midnight. During the off-season the ferry runs 6:30am-10pm, and 11pm-11:15pm. You may request an earlier ferry by speaking in person to the ferry captain before 5pm on the previous day; there is a surcharge for early ferries.

For any emergency, i.e., any circumstance requiring police, fire department, ambulance, or the hospital emergency room, call 911. The operators will communicate with everyone necessary including the ferry captain. For questions about the Ferry or service, call 508-627-9427. For information regarding weather delays, contact the Chappy Ferry hotline (508-627-6965).

Vehicle and passenger commuter books or single tickets are available for purchase from the ferry crew. Tickets are also available in the Edgartown kiosk with a card. During busy times the ferries need to synchronize and cannot always wait for all foot passengers. USPS, UPS, Fed Ex, school and emergency vehicles have boarding privileges and do not wait in line. The Chappy Ferry does not carry freight and may not be used as a drop off for deliveries. The Chappy Store--Blackbird at Jerry's Place

Blackbird Cafe will operate the general store, with convenience grocery items and dry goods, as well as its Blackbird Cafe food truck, at 219 Chappaquiddick Road. Luke and Katie Kenney, experienced coffee shop owners with four Blackbird Cafe locations in MA (including 19 North Water Street, Edgartown) are the new proprietors. The food truck and store will be open June 23 – Sept 5, 2023 from 8am-3pm daily.

The store will provide drinks for your cooler, Italian ice, milk, cheese, bacon, and other limited grocery items as well as Chappy and beach items. The food truck will offer coffee (hot and iced), muffins and pastries from the Edgartown shop, breakfast sandwiches, bagels, lunch wraps, lobster rolls, and more. It is important to note that the food truck will **not** accept "walk up" orders at the food truck window. Code Red and Emergency Notifications

Edgartown is part of a county-wide emergency notification system called Code Red. You must register to be notified by your local emergency response team in the event of emergency situations or critical community alerts. Examples include: evacuation notices, bio-terrorism alerts, boil water notices, and missing child reports. Log into www.dukescounty.org and find the line for citizen's action center.

The Town of Edgartown also uses a text notification system for sending out urgent notices. To sign up, Text the word Edgartown to 877-550-8627.

Deer

The 2023 hunting season for deer on Martha's Vineyard (Wildlife Management Zone 13) is as follows: Bow hunting 10/2-11/25; shotgun 11/27-12/9; primitive firearms 12/11-12/30. Certain hiking trails are closed during hunting season. Hunting begins 1/2 hour before sunrise and ends 1/2 hour after sunset. There is no hunting

on Sunday. Complete information can be found at www.dukescounty.org or www.mass.gov under fishing and hunting. To report violations, call the MA Environmental Police (800-632-8075).

Deer are especially fond of tulips, lilies and apples. Some deer-resistant plants include daffodils, daisies, barberry, boxwood, lavender, poppies, thyme, and broom.

Driver's Licenses and Vehicle Registration

New residents may obtain a driver's license and vehicle registration at the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles at 11 A Street in the VTA building at the Airport Business Park. Safety and emissions inspections are required for registration and thereafter on a yearly basis. Customers are strongly advised to schedule appointments online. (Martha's Vineyard RMV Service Center | Mass.gov).

For drivers' licenses, effective July 1, 2023, only proof of identity, date of birth, social security status, and Massachusetts residency are required. The RMV provides detailed information about the documentation requirements.

The Department of Homeland Security has extended the Real ID full enforcement date to May 7, 2025. Drivers wanting a Real ID license must renew in person. A Real ID License includes a small star in the upper right corner indicating compliance with federal rules, making it acceptable for federal identification. Drivers aren't required to obtain a Real ID, but if they don't, the standard license will no longer be a valid form of identification for boarding a flight within the US, or entering restricted areas in a federal building. Instead, a passport or other federal identification may be utilized.

Edgartown Village Market

Launched in 2023, the Edgartown Village Market is an open-air market making the island's goods and produce more accessible to downtown Edgartown and Chappy residents during the Vineyard's busiest months. Starting June 27, the market is held on Tuesdays, 9 am - 2 pm, at the Dr. Daniel Fisher House Garden, lower lawn. The Edgartown Village Market is a joint venture among the Vineyard Preservation Trust, Chappy Point to Point, Edgartown Board of Trade, and Grace and Zach Pinerio, who are members of the retail and artisan communities, respectively. Five seemingly distinct entities all share a goal to enhance Edgartown's downtown by creating a unique market.

Emergency

Dial **911** for all police, fire, or medical emergencies (the staff at the communication center will notify the ferry by radio). For non-emergencies or to reach the communications center dial **508-693-1212**. There are a number of defibrillators, and epi-pens at the Chappy Fire Station. All firefighters are CPR trained to the level of first responder.

A person with a possible, head, neck or back injury should not be moved. If you put the person in an automobile, the EMTs will use valuable time

extricating the patient from the car, just as if it were an automobile accident.

All residences are required by Town bylaws to display street numbers at least 3 inches high. If the home cannot be seen from the road, then the street number should be displayed on a post at the entrance to the driveway. It also helps to have the house number on the house. At night, if possible, put on the front door lights and your car flashers to assist the emergency team in locating your home. The Fire Department requires clearance of 12 feet high by 12 feet wide on driveways for ambulance and firetruck access.

Hy-Line Cruises (www.hylinecruises.com) 800-492-8082...seasonal passenger ferry service between Hyannis and Oak Bluffs, and Nantucket and Oak Bluffs. Discounts are available to full time residents.

Island Queen (<https://islandqueen.com>) 508-548-4800.... seasonal passenger ferry from 75 Falmouth Heights Road, Falmouth to Oak Bluffs.

Patriot Party Boats (www.patriotpartyboats.com), year-round passenger and freight service from Falmouth Harbor, 227 Clinton Ave., Falmouth to Oak Bluffs. (800-734-0088) or (508-548-2626). The Patriot boat does not run on federal holidays. If you missed your ferry, the Patriot Boat has a 24hour water taxi service. Call 508-548-2626. Additionally the Patriot Boat provides free shuttle service to Walmart, the Christmas Tree Shop, and other Falmouth stores.

Seastreak/Martha's Vineyard Ferry (<https://seastreak.com>)800-262-8743...one hour passenger ferry from the State Pier in New Bedford to Oak Bluffs. Seastreak will not be operating between NYC and the Vineyard for the 2023 season.

The Steamship Authority (www.steamshipauthority.com) Call 508-693-9130 or 508-477-8600. Year-round vehicle transport from Woods Hole. Passenger discount books and senior discounts are available. The SSA also offers "Preferred Space" for autos whose owners have submitted vehicle registration and driver licenses and have been approved for "Preferred Status" which is renewable each year. Excursion rates and Blue Line standby features are available for full time residents.

Vineyard Fast Ferry (<https://www.vineyardfastferry.com>) (401-295-4040) seasonal passenger ferry from 1347 Roger Williams Way, North Kingstown, RI to Oak Bluffs. Shuttle connections are offered to the Providence Airport and the Amtrak station.

Fishing

Recreational anglers fishing in the marine waters of Massachusetts must possess a Saltwater Fishing Permit, which cost \$10 for residents and non-residents. No permit is needed for those who are: under 16 years of age, fishing on permitted for-hire vessels, or disabled as defined in M.G.L.c.19c, regardless of age. Individuals 60 and older must obtain a permit, but the permit is free. For more information or to purchase a permit visit www.mass.gov/marinefisheries or call 617-626-1520.

The Martha's Vineyard Land Bank maintains many beautiful properties and hiking trails on Chappy that are open to the public daily from sunrise to sundown except during hunting season. Library

Throughout the year, the Edgartown Library offers a variety of programs for both adults and children. Library cards are free to all Massachusetts residents and Island property owners. Out-of-state visitors pay a one-time fee of \$10 for a library card. The Edgartown Library's nearly 40,000 books, magazines, videos, DVDS, audiobooks, and CDs are only the tip of the iceberg. Through the CLAMS network of 38 member libraries (including all Island libraries), more than 1.5 million additional items are available to Edgartown library patrons, and can easily be searched and requested online.

The library provides faxing and copying services, has public computers available for use, and free wi-fi throughout the building. Island libraries go beyond book-lending, and allow checkouts for Mobile hotspots, Chromebooks, DVD players, musical instruments, puzzles, microscopes, and more! Mail & Shipping

US MAIL. Your mailbox should have your name and address clearly marked on the right side. Mail is being sorted out of Vineyard Haven (508- 693-2818). Please advise the Vineyard Haven Post Office when you arrive. When you are leaving, fill out a forwarding notice, even if you do not expect additional mail. This will enable our carrier to be as accurate as possible. Please contact the Vineyard Haven office before putting up a new mailbox, or, if you have additional questions.

Certified mail, express mail, and undelivered packages will be held however, at the Edgartown Post Office for pickup --after 4 pm the day of notice. The Edgartown post office window is open Monday-Friday 8:30 am-4:30 pm, and Saturday 10 am-1 pm. There is a US Postbox next to the Chappy Ferry slip at the Point with a 10:30 am pickup. For mail forwarding information refer to www.usps.com for details.

UPS delivers packages directly to the house, or alternatively to the UPS container near the Chappy Store. The container will stay in place for the foreseeable future, will not be locked at night, and will be accessible 24/7.

Most properties are accessible for the UPS driver with the exception of the last two at the end of North Neck Road, and Cape Pogue beyond Dike Bridge. If your property is inaccessible for any reason, contact the main UPS office, open daily between 7:30 and 6pm, at 508-693-7023. The drivers will not deal with locked gates, but rather leave these deliveries in the container. Note UPS has a store at 455 State Road, Vineyard Haven (508 696-0600), open Monday- Friday 7:30-6pm, and Saturday 8:30-2pm.

FEDEX delivers to your door or leaves a slip.

The MAILROOM in Edgartown, at 243 Edgartown-Vineyard Haven Road, handles packing, shipping, printing and business service needs including UPS and FEDEX. For more information email micromac@gmail.com or call 508-939-1387.

Medical

The Martha's Vineyard Hospital (508-693-0410) is located at 1 Hospital Road in Oak Bluffs. The Hospital's emergency room is open at all times and provides care to all persons, all ages, without regard to health insurance status. For emergencies call 911. For additional information check www.mvhospital.org .

Island Health Care, is located at 245 Edgartown-Vineyard Haven Road in the Stop & Shop Pharmacy building. The office is open Monday -Wednesday from 8 am to 8 pm, and Thursday - Saturday from 8am to 4pm, but closed for lunch daily 12-1p. Please call for an appointment at 508-939-9358. <https://www.ihimv.org>

Vineyard Medical Care has a Walk-In Medical Center on 364 State Road, Vineyard Haven, (across from Cronigs) and is open from 8 am—4pm Monday through Friday. New patients are welcome. Call 508-693-4400 for an appointment. Same day often available. www.vineyardmedicalcare.com for more information. On-site laboratory testing is available.

Norton Point Beach

In 2022 Norton Point Beach, formerly an isthmus running between South Beach and Wasque, and owned by Dukes County, was breached in a winter storm. The Edgartown Parks Department took over the management of this property effective March 2023, and is developing rules and regulations. OSV permits may be purchased on the Town website. www.edgartown-ma.us. At times beach access may be restricted due to the nesting of endangered shorebirds. For the latest conditions, text "beach" to 877-550-8627.

Parking at the Point

Pay attention to the signs or you risk a ticket. Paved lot--4 hours parking. Unpaved (stone)lot--24 hours. A car will be towed after 24 hours.

On the Outer Harbor side of Chappaquiddick Road, (right side as you drive toward Town), parking is allowed along the road--up to the exit of the stone parking lot. Note all 4 wheels must be off the pavement to avoid ticketing and your car must be facing the ferry. This area is limited. Pay attention to the signs.

On the Inner Harbor side of Chappaquiddick Road (right side as you drive off the ferry), no parking is allowed between 7am and 7 pm from the Point to the cut-out for the ferry line. Parking is allowed on the green space after 7pm and along the pavement after the ferry cutout and your car must be facing away from the ferry with all 4 wheels off the pavement. Please pay close attention to the signage posted in these areas.

Parking is allowed in the Dark Woods Parking Lot at the triangle (near the Post Office) for up to 72 hours. If it is necessary to leave your car for a longer period, call the non-emergency police number (508-627-4343). The Police Department will normally grant any reasonable request. Any vehicle left in this lot over 72 hours without prior permission may be considered abandoned and towed. Businesses can receive a permit for long term parking in this lot by calling the Selectmen's Office.

Phone Service

Verizon publishes an annual phone book available online at www.verizon.com/whitepages, and also delivered by mail. (Note Comcast telephone listings are not included.) More complete listings are in the small phone book called the Island Book, which is available at certain banks. Additional Martha's Vineyard information is found in the green pages of the Island Book.

Public Access and Small Boat Launching

Quammox Road and Wasque Road are public rights of way to the water. The Land Bank has acquired beach frontage and acreage at the end of Quammox, and has cleared a parking area and provided a turnaround for boat launching. Prams and small sailboats left on the Quammox beach need a permit from the Land Bank (508) 627-7141. There are also places to launch canoes, rowboats, and kayaks at Dike Bridge, Cove Meadow off Jeffers Lane, and the Gardner property at the Point. Any boat that is on a mooring or haul-out is under the jurisdiction of the Harbormaster (508-627-4746).

Please note that beach property adjacent to the public access property is privately owned. Ownership rights in waterfront property extend to the mean low water mark. The public has the right to cross this land for fishing and fowling purposes when carrying the appropriate gear. This law is unique to MA and Maine.

Recycling Center and Refuse Transfer Center

The MV Refuse Disposal District is located at 750 Edgartown West Tisbury Rd., on the left hand side, before the airport, and after Barnes Road. The entrance is easy to miss. Residents may purchase books of 10 coupons, or a punch card, for \$50. Each coupon is good for a 32 gallon bag or barrel. Charges for truckloads of trash and garbage are by weight. A \$35 recycling permit must be purchased with proof of residency. (There is a senior discount for residents.) A permit must be shown for recycling which is otherwise free. Recyclables include: Plastic, glass, cans, bagged or tied newspapers, magazines, office paper and cardboard. No pizza boxes. The center is open every day except Monday. Hours are ordinarily 8 am to 3:30 pm, although the scale closes at 3 pm. However on Sunday the center closes early at 2 pm and the scale closes at 1:30 pm. (Tel. 508-627-4501). www.mvrefusedistrict.com

Household hazardous waste disposal dates are July 15, and October 21, 2023 from 9 until noon. Latex paint is not accepted. When feasible, the CIA arranges for a Chappy pickup. Check the bulletin boards.

Septic Systems

The Island is fragile and Chappy does not have a sewer system. Septic systems are utilized, and must dispose of waste water and treat it so it's suitable to return to the ground. Do not place non-biodegradable objects, grease, or strong chemicals down your sink or toilet. Use low or no-

phosphate dishwasher detergent. Septic tanks should be inspected by a licensed professional and pumped out periodically. For additional information see [Buying or Selling Property with a Septic System | Mass.gov](#).

Shellfish License

A license is required to gather shellfish. Licenses may be obtained at the Town Hall. A family permit for residents is \$50/yr: non-residents pay \$250/yr. The license is free for senior residents 60 and older. A weekly permit for non-residents is available for \$50. The rules and regulations are on the permit.

While shell fishing, all family license holders must: have a permit, a shellfish measuring gauge, and picture identification. A family permit may not be used to fish more than once a week, and the maximum yield per week is 1/2 bushel of shellfish. The bay scallop limit is 1 bushel/wk. Bay scallops can only be harvested from October-March.

Sheriff's Meadow Foundation

Sheriff's Meadow is a nonprofit conservation group that owns land on Martha's Vineyard. Gifts to the Chappy Fund are administered by Sheriff's Meadow. Slip Away Farm

Located across the street from the Community Center, the Slip Away farm stand, Chappaquiddick's original one-room schoolhouse, opens in June from Thursday-Saturday from 10 am to 5pm, and in July and August, from Wednesday through Saturday, (10 am to 5 pm). Lily Walter reports that the Farm grows their own veggies and flowers for the stand, with occasional additions from other Island farms. The farm stand also provides basic kitchen & pantry items, Flat Point Farm soaps and lotions, and Marshall Farm lamb and chicken in the freezer.

Slip Away Farm has a special focus on flowers this year: flower shares for weekly pickup in July and August are still available; and private floral classes, DIY event flower buckets, as well as event floral design work can be arranged.

Two major events scheduled this year were the June 10th Pig Roast Spring Barbeque and the July 14th Summer Farm Dinner.

Speed Limit-- 25 MPH is the posted speed limit.

Swimming

Free swimming beaches are located at the Ferry Point and Katama Bay. Katama Bay can be accessed from Wasque Avenue, Quammox, or by boat.

East Beach and Wasque, managed by the Trustees of Reservation(TTOR), provide access for a fee. Generally East Beach (across from Dike Bridge) has gentler waves and less surf than Wasque.

Norton Point Beach (Atlantic coast beach starting at the eastern end of Katama Beach and ending at Chappy), has been cut off from Chappy in a winter storm. Norton Point Beach and other Edgartown beaches are being managed by the Edgartown Parks Department, have lifeguards and free public swimming.

No lifeguards are on duty on Chappy, and swimmers must be cautious. If you are caught in a rip current, and are being pulled out to sea, do not panic and do not swim against the current. Rather, swim parallel to the shore until you are out of the current. Rip currents are rarely more than thirty feet wide. For emergencies call 911.

Ticks

Deer ticks, lone star ticks, and dog ticks are present on Martha’s Vineyard and are transmitters of disease. The Martha’s Vineyard Tick Borne Illness Prevention Initiative offers yard surveys for all residents. Contact <https://www.mvboh.com>, or Patrick Roden-Reynolds, health biologist at Island Health Care (508-939-9358, and head of the Island Tick-Borne Disease project, for additional information. Permethrin treated clothing is recommended for outdoor activities. Additionally, tick and mosquito spraying is offered by several Island businesses. All the MV medical facilities are very attentive to tick bites. Prompt treatment for tick bites is recommended. The MV Hospital, open 24 hours, and a same day appointment at the Vineyard Medical Care (508-693-4400) on State Road can afford quick service.

Trails

Chappaquiddick is blessed with miles of beautiful hiking trails. A free app, TrailsMV, is now available for your cell phones, and uses GPS to guide you through the woods and fields of the Island. Trail maps are also available from the various land conservation organizations, i.e., the Land Bank www.mvlandbank.com, www.sheriffsmeadow.org, and www.ttor.org.

Transit Authority

Schedules and route information can be obtained at the Visitor Center on Church Street and at www.vineyardtransit.com. Buses do not have cash. Exact fare is strongly suggested on buses. One way fares are \$2.00 per town peak-season (\$1.25 off-season) including the town of origin. Change is given in the form of stored value cards for future use. Most Edgartown buses originate at Church Street except for #11, which is free and runs between the Triangle and the bench at Mayhew Lane. Travel within Edgartown on other buses as far as the triangle is also free.

One Day, 3 Day, 7 Day, 31 Day, 100 Day and 365 Day travel passes can be purchased from a smartphone at app.vineyardtransit.com. These digital passes will permit contactless boarding. Physical passes (1 Day, 3 Day, 7 Day travel) can be purchased on the bus, at the Steamship Authority Terminals, or the VTA main office at 11 A Street in the Airport Business Park. The 31-day and annual passes can only be purchased at the Visitor Center, or the VTA main office.

Persons with disabilities and senior citizens (65+) receive a substantial discount on all tickets. Annual passes are available for Island seniors for \$40 if purchased through the Councils on Aging. Island students (age 7-17) may purchase annual passes for \$50 at their schools. Children (age 6 and under) ride free when accompanied by an adult. Non-island senior and youth passes are \$75.

A free app, TransLoc Rider, (Martha's Vineyard is the selection) shows the real-time location and arrival times of your bus.

Trustees of Reservations (TTOR)

The Trustees of Reservations is a non-profit Massachusetts conservation organization that owns East Beach, most of Wasque and Cape Pogue, and Mytoi, a Japanese-style garden in an open pine forest. Membership in The Trustees allows free or discounted access to all their properties in Massachusetts. Nonmembers pay admission fees to the beaches. New this year, the Trustees are charging for parking at Wasque for most visitors!

Darci Schofield is the Islands Program Director overseeing the Island operations on Nantucket and Martha's Vineyard. Dan Karparis, the Down Island Steward, is managing beach operations and stewardship on Chappaquiddick. Eli Ptaszynski is the Up-Island Steward. Shea Fee is the Trustees' ecologist overseeing the shorebird protection program. Rangers and gatehouse attendants at Chappy properties are working to ensure smooth operations and safe, enjoyable experiences on the beaches. For beach emergencies, please call 508-627-7689. For tours and other information call 508-627-3599.

TTOR posts weekly beach updates on social media (www.facebook.com/trusteesmv) and also has a beach access hotline (508-627-8390). Visitors should check the beach status prior to arrival. The TTOR website is www.the.trustees.org.

Over-sand car travel on TTOR property requires an over-sand permit year round. Please see The Trustees OSV Driving Guide, available at permit pick up and online

at <https://thetrustees.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/04/Beach-Driving-Guide.v.4.7.22.pdf>. Adherence to the rules and regulations ensures a safe and enjoyable visit for everyone and violations may result in permit suspension and/or revocation. See Winching for further information. It is particularly important that visitors observe all shorebird signs. Nesting shorebirds and their chicks are protected by state and federal law. Dogs should be leashed at all times. All trash should be carried out.

Water

All homes on Chappy have well water that essentially comes from one underground aquifer. Conservation benefits everyone on Chappy. In dry periods we should be especially careful to conserve water. Edgartown restricts the application of lawn fertilizer. Detailed information can be found at www.mvboh.com. The Wampanoag Tribe Water Testing Laboratory provides comprehensive testing of water samples. Bottles for testing can be obtained from the Edgartown Board of Health, or the Dukes County Offices near the Airport. The Edgartown Board of Health will assist you with collecting your water sample and transporting it to a laboratory. Please contact the Board of Health at 508-627-6120 for specific information.

Weather Related Emergencies

Occasionally summer and winter storms can cause power outages on Chappaquiddick. Every household should have emergency supplies which include candles or battery-operated lights, a battery operated radio, emergency water supply for drinking and toilets, and if the house does not have an emergency generator, a camping stove or grill. Safety is paramount and generators should not be used indoors, and grills should not be used on wooden decks.

With few exceptions, when power is out, the landline phones are out. For emergency, calls can be made to 911. Non-emergency calls can be made to 508-693-1212. Additionally the Chappy Fire Station has an emergency call box outside the station. Open it up and push the button. When possible, the Chappy Fire Station will be open and available for respite during severe emergencies.

Potable water is available from the pump at the Chappy Fire Station. A bathtub filled with water before a storm will provide a good supply to refill toilet tanks. Helpful websites include www.redcross.org and www.nhc.noaa.gov.

Homeowners should go to www.dukescounty.org and register for the county emergency notification system (Code Red). This notification system extends to landlines, cell phones, and emails.

At this time Edgartown continues to maintain a texting emergency notification system. Text the word "Edgartown" to 877-550-8627.

Winching

Over-sand vehicle permits are required— by the Trustees for TTOR property, and by the Edgartown Parks Department for Norton Point Beach. **If your tire pressure is more than 15psi, you WILL get stuck in the sand.** It is imperative to lower your tire pressure when accessing the beach. There are air pumps at Mytoi and Atlantic Avenue. For help when stuck in the sand on the TTOR properties (East Beach or Wasque) from 9am-5pm, call the Mytoi Gate House (508-627-3599).

Unfortunately, the voluntary after-hours courtesy patrols by the Surfcasters Association has been discontinued. For winching help after hours, call the Dukes County Communications Center at 508-693-1212. Winch services may incur additional fees.
